At Supreme Protection, we recognise the critical role of environmental stewardship in our business practices. Our commitment extends beyond compliance—we actively strive to protect the environment and promote sustainability. Our approach is listed below.

- 1. ISO 14001 Certification:** We proudly hold ISO 14001 certification for Environmental Management Systems. This rigorous standard ensures that our environmental practices align with international best practices. Through ISO 14001, we continuously assess, improve, and monitor our environmental performance.
- 2. Compliance with Regulations:** Supreme Protection diligently adheres to all relevant environmental regulations. We consider them a baseline, not a limit. Our goal is to exceed regulatory requirements wherever possible.
- 3. Employee Awareness:** We promote environmental awareness among all employees. Our policy emphasises the importance of sustainable practices. This is provided through our staff inductions, training programs and regular communication to reinforce our commitment.
- 4. Resource Efficiency:** We optimise resource usage, minimise waste, and reduce our ecological footprint. Energy-efficient operations, waste reduction, and responsible procurement are integral to our approach.
- 5. Transparency and Reporting:** We maintain transparency by communicating our environmental strategies, targets, and performance. Regular reporting ensures accountability and encourages continuous improvement.

Supreme Protection remains dedicated to environmental responsibility. By integrating sustainability into our core operations, we contribute to a healthier planet for current and future generations.

We will avoid waste by

- Reducing the production of waste material, including unnecessary packaging when we forward information or equipment, including returns.
- Recycling all our uniforms and equipment where possible, encouraging reuse of materials.
- Disposing of waste in a safe and responsible manner.
- Ensuring water and energy are not wasted during the conduct of our business activities by;
 - Using energy only where necessary (e.g. switching of monitors when not in use)
 - Preventing pollutants entering our drainage system.
 - Using water wisely and efficiently.

Materials and Resources

- We use recycled paper and other materials sourced from sustainable providers.
- We are eliminating paper based reporting by utilising technology for reporting.
- We purchase products with the principle and policy of using materials in a sustainable way.
- We have a major emphasis on purchasing locally made goods to support our business.
- We purchase equipment with an emphasis on long term usage.

Climate Action

Introduction

At Supreme Protection, we recognise the urgent need to combat climate change and its far-reaching impacts. We are committed to implementing decisive action to address this global challenge, to enable us to contribute to climate resilience and sustainability within our organisation and the broader community. Below we explore how Supreme Protection contributes to achieving Climate Action.

Our Approach

1. Mitigating Greenhouse Gas Emissions

Action: Supreme Protection actively reduces its carbon footprint by maintaining a fleet with **70% hybrid or electric vehicles**. We currently have **over 40 vehicles**. We are transitioning away from petrol engines by 2028. Our energy-efficient Security Manager App eliminates paper-based reporting, and we choose green energy for offices where possible. By Q4 2026, we plan to monitor **Scope 1 & 2 emissions** and seek a rating from the **Carbon Disclosure Project (CDP) by year-end**.

Impact: We have eliminated all paper based reporting and recycle all uniforms and equipment. We have also slashed our emissions from our patrolling activities by switch to electric vehicles. By minimising greenhouse gas emissions, we contribute to global efforts to limit temperature rise and combat climate change.

2. Resilience Planning

Action: We prioritise climate resilience in our business practices. This includes assessing vulnerabilities, developing adaptation strategies, and ensuring continuity during extreme weather events as part of our Business Continuity Planning.

Impact: We are able to maintain our services to protect our customers resilience helps protect our employees, clients, and assets from climate-related risks.





3. Sustainable Transportation

Action: Supreme Protection encourages sustainable transportation options. We use shuttle buses for large events, such as for the 2025 **Notting Hill Carnival**, where we used electric vehicles and public transportation to transport over **80 officers**. We achieved a **Carbon Saving of 567 kg CO₂** for the **Carnival** using efficient logistics to reduce emissions.

Impact: We plan to calculate our emissions by Q4 of 2026 to achieve a sustainability rating with the **Carbon Disclosure Project**.

4. Advocacy and Awareness

Action: We engage with our stakeholders to raise awareness about climate change. This includes creating an Action Plan for the **UN Sustainable Development Goals** to receive and approve.

Impact: By fostering understanding and action, we contribute to a more informed and engaged community.

5. Supporting Global Agreements

Action: Supreme Protection aligns with international agreements such as the **Paris Agreement**. We commit to limiting global temperature rise and striving for 1.5 degrees Celsius.

Impact: Our collective efforts contribute to a safer, more sustainable planet for future generations.





Supreme Protection Roadmap to further Enhance Sustainability

Over 70% of our 40-plus vehicle fleet is already hybrid or electric, and we are on track to operate a fully hybrid/electric fleet by 2028.

By end of year, we will report carbon savings for all our customers and achieved a reduction of 567 kg CO₂ for Notting Hill Carnival alone.

We will widen access to our roles for disabled people, the long-term unemployed, and women, with progress reported in Q4.
